Directions to April 14 Meeting



Hosta 'Fuji Botan'

Discovered on the slopes of Mt. Fuji, this plain green hosta produces stunningly gorgeous flowers. Perhaps a form of *H. montana*, or perhaps *H. rectifolia*, its ancestry is uncertain.

The leaves form a 2 ft. by 2 ft. mound; but the flower scapes easily grow to 48 in. The scapes make a nice cut flower because they gracefully droop like bleeding hearts.

Inside the flowers, only vestigial sexual organs are present. This would lead one to think that it could not be used for hybridizing. But, after corresponding with Don Dean, I learned that there is a small amount of viable pollen in the small structure near the middle of the lower picture. Unfortunately, the characteristics for double flowers don't seem to transfer to seedlings.

Move over 'Aphrodite', you're not the only flower in the garden anymore!



A delightful assortment of soups was present at the February meeting.
